PRUNING SCHOOL TO BE HELD SOON

By Gordon G. Brown December 5-8 inclusive, a pruning school will be conducted in the Hood River valley. The purpose for which this course is offered is to familiarize the grower with the fundamental un-derlying this practice. It is not hoped to turn out expert pruners from amateur stock in two or three days' training, but it is reasonable to expect that anyone taking this course will become proficient in handling the problems as they arise in the average orchard. Two district schools will be conduct-

ed, one at Parkdale during Monday and Tuesday, December 5 and 6 inclusive. The remaining two days will be spent in the Lower Valley with the city of Hood River as headquarters. A one-half day indoor session will be held in the McIsaac hall during the morning of December 5. The remainder of the time in that section will be spent in the orchard. The indoor ses-sion in the Lower Valley, will be held in Library hall of Hood River, in the morning of December 7. The remain-ing one and one-half days will likewise spent in the East Side and West

ide orchards. The writer especially desires to im-press upon those who contemplate takng this course, the importance of attending the indoor sessions. There all preliminary discussion of fundamentals will be carried on and will not be re-peated in the field. This is important. Be there and make the most of this opportunity. Field work will be a practical application of pruning. The work will be immediately in charge of Clayton L. Long, extension specialist of the Oregon Agricultural College, assisted by members of the local Experiment tation staff.

This is the second pruning school to be held locally. In 1917 a very successful school was held and attended by a large number of growers. This year the enrollment will undoubtedly be large. Any one is eligible for this course and no charges will be made. Watch the date and be on hand.

UPPER VALLEY SPUD CROP IS SHORT

The Upper Valley potato crop will not be affected by the heavy snowfall that covers the district, according to J. F. Thompson, who was here Saturday, other than that the weather conditions, if they linger, will prevent movement of the crop. "Practically all of the district's po-tatoes were dug," says Mr. Thomp-son, "but not more than 10 per cent had been sold and shipped. Growers have stored their potatoes in pits. The Jpper Valley potato yield was very disappointing this year. We expected 100 cars. We will not get over 60. The quality, however, is very high, and all growers are expecting top rices for their tubers.
