

This will bring the total of advances on supplies and distribution of cash to \$1,380,000 on the 1921 crop. The following prices on d'Anjou pear pools for the past season, which have been closed, have been announced: 17,185 boxes of combination of extra fancy and C-grade, 165s and larger, \$2.75 per box; 126 boxes of combination, 180 to 210, \$2.50 seven boxes of small combinati \$1.85; 4,084 boxes of C-grade, 165 and larger, \$2.10; 160 boxes of C-grade, 180 to 210, \$1.85, and 1 box of small C-grade \$1.60; 2,099 boxes of Special, 165 and larger, \$2.26; eight boxes of Special, 180 to 210, \$2, and 7,824 half boxes, \$1.55. The total d'Anjou crop returned \$73,266. Charges of the Association, including storage, reached 16 cents per box and eight cents per half box.




