The official announcement of the total population of the United States for 1900 is 76,296,220, of which 74,627,907 are contained in the forty-five states, representing approximately the population to be used for apportionment purposes. present census should be compared, was Mexico. Taking the 1890 population as a basis, there has been a gain in population of 13,225,464, during the last ten years, representing an increase of nearly 21 per cent.


