STATE LAND BOARD , MAKES GOOD RULE

Salem, April 22. -At a meeting of the state land board it was decided to put an immediate stop to the continual abuse of the Carey act by "wildcat" corporations in the unirrigated districts of this state. It has been the usual practice of some corporations to apply for irrigation lands having only enough funds to hire legal assistance, take over projects, sell land to settlers and proceed to establish irrigation systems on capital derived from the sale of the lands and thus compel the settlers to bear the burden and take long chances on the success or failure of the projects.

In determining the settlement of this question once for all, the state land board will hereafter demand from irrigation corporations desiring to take advantage of the Carey act, a substantial bond or other surety before an application for irrigated land will be granted, and it will be compulsory upon the part of firms backing irrigation projects to prove to the state land board that the lands granted will be developed without first being sold to settlers, and that the corporation undertaking such development has the necessary capital with which to complete the project.
