Adaptability of Lake to Fruits and Agricultural Products Proven

Today the greater number of the delegates to the Central Oregon Development League convention will take their departure for home, all well pleased with the work accomplished. We of Lakeview have been much benefited by their presence and they in turn have doubtless added much to their knowledge of the resources and possibilities of the whole State, and more particularly what is known as South Central Oregon. All agree that the opportunities awaiting the husbandman in Lake county cannot be realized by those who have even made a casual trip through the country, for owing to its sparsely settled condition it is only by assembling the products of various farms at one point that a fair idea can be gained of what is really grown here.

Even the most skeptical would have been convinced had he seen the wonderful gathering of exhibits at the High School during the League meet for, while not matured yet the samples of fruits and agricultural products showed conclusively that this is a land where things grow to perfection.

B. F. Chandler, of Quincy Cal., was formerly engaged in gardening on an extensive scale, and he expressed himself to an Examiner representative to the effect that there was no question as to the possibilities of this agricultural standpoint. He came here with the idea that this was simply a mountainous country principally adapted to stock growing, and of little value from any other point of view. After seeing the exhibits he at once reached a contrary opinion, and is now confident that a wonderful change will take place in this country in the very near future.

## KLAMATH MEN BUY MEXICAN CATTLE

Louis Gerber and Alex Davis Will Ship in 1500 Head This Fall

Klamath Northwestern: Louis Gerber and Alex Davis, Klamath County cattle men, have returned from Mexico where they purchased about 1500 head of cattle which will be brought here in October. The cattle will be wintered here and shipped south in the summer months. "Mexico is all right," said Gerber yesterday, "but I do not think much of Madero's soldiers. ## HOME IN WATSON ADDITION BURNED

A. C. Pratt Loses All Household Effects by Fire Thursday Morning

The residence in the Watson addition occupied by A. C. Pratt and owned by E. E. Bond was destroyed by fire Thursday morning. So quickly was it enveloped in flames that none of the household effects were saved, and the loss falls very heavily on Mr. Pratt, who is fireman on the N.-C.-O.

The fire was caused by coals dropping from the stove. Mrs. Pratt who was visiting a nearby neighbor, directed her little daughter to replenish the fire, and in so doing the coals dropped to the floor. The little one failed to notify her mother of the accident, and a few moments the flames burst out, and before the fire department reached the scene the building was completely gutted. However by hard, heroic work on part of the citizens the flames were prevented from reaching J. P. Duckworth's house which is occupied by Mr. and Mrs. Harry Vernon, and stood about twenty feet from the one destroyed.

## SHERIFF SNIDER GETS HIS FEE

## Sale of Indian Lands

The President and the Secretary of the Interior have ordered about one and one-half million acres of Indian lands, in the former Shoshone (in Wyoming), Uintah (in Utah), and Crow (in Montana) Indian Reservations, to be sold at public auction by James W. Witten, Superintendent of Opening and Sale of Indian Lands, at minimum prices charging from 50 cents to \$1.50 per acre. The sales will begin at Lander, Wyoming, on September 19; at Provo, Utah, on October 8, and at Billings, Montana, on October 21, 1912.

Not more than six hundred acres will be sold to any one purchaser on bids made in person or through agents, and no residence or cultivation will be required. Patents will be issued as soon as the purchase price is paid.
