## BIG GUNS OF THE NAVY.

**Serious Effects of Concussion on the Nervous System.**  
"The imminent danger," says Surgeon General Rixey, "of the serious and in a measure preventable accident, rupture of the eardrums, demands consideration in preparation for target practice or battle, and every man should be compelled to employ pledges of cotton or a worthy substitute for filling the auditory orifices. The necessity of compulsion in a matter so rational may be surprising, but the fact is neither officers nor men take kindly to the use of such artificial protection, though the practice is more universal than it was a few years ago. Many of the gun crews in the navy suffer from deafness of variable duration after target practice, and in a severe naval action it is probable that the impact of suddenly compressed air or repeated violent air vibrations consequent upon big gun fire and the bursting of the enemy's shells would produce not only deafness (temporary or permanent) among the personnel of the ships, but also a dazed mental condition, which is a recognized result that would have the effect of physical disablement. There is a difference in the effects of mere noise, per se, and the shock of concussion, for it is said that when it is expected the ear marvellously accommodates itself in advance, and the concussion is more or less discounted. But when the ear or brain is not forewarned the danger of serious and extensive damage is more imminent. For example, experience has shown that men are never so much affected by their own guns as by a gun fired suddenly without their knowledge. The time has come when a careless disregard of the effects of gun fire upon the hearing and upon the nervous system, through the ear, should be condemned by the authorities. There is no cure for established gun deafness, and no power on earth can restore a shattered auditory nerve. Prevention can alone deal with it, and the medical bureau hopes that some action may be taken by the navy department. The bureau has been making some study of the various expedients and devices suggested for such protection with a view ultimately of indicating those deserving recognition and from among which choice may be made. But the adoption of any one to the entire exclusion of others within the range of efficiency is neither necessary nor desirable. Action is needed only to the end that some efficient protection be made obligatory among those exposed to the concussion of gun fire or shell explosion, and the bureau has recommended a general order to that effect."—Washington Star.

**The Speedy Mohawk.**  
According to the Shipping World of London, the new high speed turbine torpedo boat destroyer Mohawk, which recently had several trial speed tests under forced draft in the North sea, is one of the fastest war vessels in the world. While all the official figures concerning her speed tests have not been made public, it has been learned that she maintained for six hours a speed of 34 1/4 knots and later warmed up to a quarter of a knot better on six consecutive tests over a mile course. The Mohawk, which is propelled by five turbines, three ahead and two astern, was built by J. B. White & Co. of East Cowes under license from the Parsons Marine Steam Turbine company. Her turbines represent 14,000 indicated horsepower, the steam of which is generated by six water tube boilers fired by liquid fuel, of which she can carry seventy-three tons. She is 270 feet long, has a beam of twenty-five feet, a draft of eight feet and a displacement of 765 tons.
