ROWING REGATTAS AT THE SEATTLE FAIR.

Negotiations are on to bring the Cornell, Yale and Harvard rowing crews to Seattle during the Alaska-Yukon-Pacific exposition next summer. It is planned to hold at least one regatta on Lake Washington each month during the exposition, which opens June 1 and closes October 16. All arrangements have been made for a series of races between California, Stanford and the University of Washington and Wisconsin. Other middle west colleges have also been asked to send crews.

It is planned to make the rowing regatta a feature of the sports during the fair and a big purse will be hung up to bring out the Cornell, Harvard and Yale crews. The exposition management will submit a proposition to the three eastern colleges and will make any reasonable arrangements to carry out the plan.

The arrangements have been concluded for the track meet of all Pacific coast colleges and high schools in Seattle during the exposition. While the dates have not been definitely set, the colleges and schools of the coast have agreed to hold their 1909 championship games in Seattle and the arrangements of the schedule will be made early in January.

It is also planned to bring the annual army and navy championship games to Seattle next year.

Another big feature of the sporting program will be the international bal-

loon races. Representatives of various aero clubs are now in Seattle concluding the arrangements which will bring airships, balloons and aeroplanes to Seattle from all parts of the United States and from many foreign countries.

EDUCATION IN CHINA.

The Chinese Board of Education has recently issued ten regulations governing the educational matters throughout the empire. Here are some of them:

Every capital city must have at least 100 primary schools and a minimum of 5000 students. All prefectures and districts must have at least 40 schools and a minimum of 2000 students.

Every child at the age of seven years shall be compelled to attend school.

Any official succeeding in persuading gentry to found schools shall be rewarded.

The parents of any child at seven years of age or over shall be held responsible for the attendance at the school of such child, and will be punished in the event of its failure to attend.

All prefects and magistrates who fail to obtain the stipulated number of schools and students in their respective districts will be punished.

At his farewell concert among the patrons were the Prince and Princess of Wales and the Duke and Duchess of Connaught, who have aided in making Elman a fashionable pet in Great Britain.

The troops are returning to their homes. A small force will be maintained just for a while at Murray and Eddyville, Ky.

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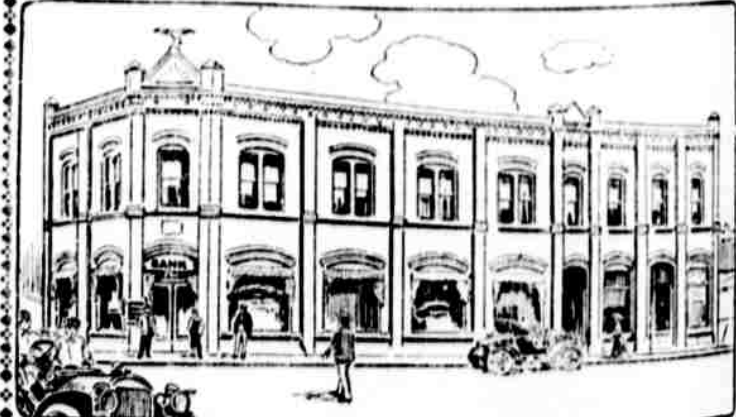
