TO DISPEL FOG WITH ELECTRICITY.

LONDON. Sir Oliver Lodge, the great electrical scientist, believes that he will be able shortly to rid the British Isles of one of the worst enemies of their prosperity—that variety of fog which from time to time lies up the entire country of whole communities. The matter is of such great commercial importance, leaving out other considerations, that the Highway Committee of the Westminster City Council has decided to give Mr. Lodge every chance to prove the value of his discovery.

The Oliver's idea upon which he has been working for some time, is to dispel fog banks by electrical discharge. Thus far he has conducted his experiments on a small scale, either in laboratory or under unfavorable conditions, and yet he has had such success that it is believed a great secret has been discovered. The Westminster Council has rented a large open space of ground near Grosvenor Canal, where, within a few weeks, an experiment will be carried out. It will cost £10,000.
