A Christmas dinner was given at George Copeland's Christmas day.

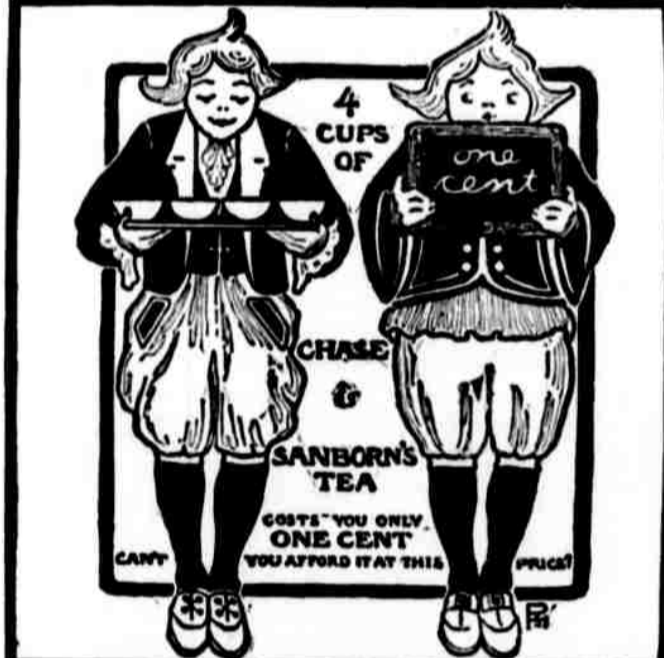
