SACRAMENTO, Calif., Oct. 16 .-Because George Hjarapst, a wealthy lumberman of Humboldt county, made a will dividing his estate valued \$101,700 between twenty-seven nephews and nicces, the state of California loses most of the inheritance tax placed upon the estate.

In computing the tax the figures are compiled according to the number of heirs, and had the estate been left to one nephew or niece the state's share would have amounted to \$2,-437. As it is, the state will collect \$77.76. Each of the heirs received
