BEST ALL-ROUND ATHLETE IS TO BE DETERMINED

Pentathlon at Olympic Games at Stockholm Will Be to Pick Finest General Sportsman by Means of Tests in Five Branches of Stunts

LONDON, March 13.—The most important feature of the Olympic games at Stockholm next June, according to Rev. R. S. de Bourcy Fafan, secretary of the British Olympic Association, will be the Pentathlon, by which will be determined the best all-around sportsman in the world. Contestants will have to compete in five branches of sport—quiet shooting, swimming, fencing, running and cross-country racing. The quiet shooting is really pistol practice at a whole figure target, 1.7 meter or 51.18 inches, high and divided into three zones which is viable to three seconds at intervals of 10 seconds.

WILL HAUNT SHERIFF IS THREAT OF MURDERER

Man Who Killed Four Members of Family and Gets Death Sentence, Delivers Grievous Dictum to Officer in Whose Keeping He's Placed

ST. JOSEPH, Mo., March 13.—Hoz Rasco, who will be hanged March 26 for the murder of the four members of the Oda Hubbell family near Guilford, Mo., was removed secretly from the jail here, where he has been held for safe keeping for the last year, and taken to Maryville, Mo., where he was placed in the death cell.

"If I am hanged I will be forever with you," said Rasco to the sheriff. "In your work day by day you will be thinking of me, and in your dreams at night I will haunt you. You have treated me like a dog, and have given me a dirty deal. Now, don't you ever speak to me again, for I shall never speak to you during the two weeks I have to live. I am innocent, and you know it."
