To Marie L. Gifford and Chas. N. Tibbette, Defendants Above Named.

In the name of the State of Oregon You and each of you, are hereby required to appear and answer the complaint filed against you in the above-entitled suit, on or before the 11th day of June, 1912, that being the last day of the publication of this summons and the last day within which you are required to answer, as fixed by the order of publication of this summons.

If you fail to appear and answer, the plaintiff will apply to the court for the relief demanded in said complaint.

Said suit is brought to foreclose a mortgage, dated March 8, 1909, and executed in favor of the plaintiff by the defendant, Marie L. Gifford, upon the following described real property, to-wit:

The NW 1/4 of Sec. 32, Tp. 41 S., R. 3 E., W. M., in Klamath county, Oregon.

To secure to the plaintiff the payment of three promissory notes, dated March 8, 1909, for \$1,000 each, with interest thereon at the rate of 8 per cent per annum from date thereof, and reasonable attorneys' fees for services of attorneys herein, said notes being payable one, two and three years after date, respectively.

Plaintiff in said suit prays for the following decree:

1.—That he have judgment against the defendant, Marie L. Gifford, for the principal sum of \$3,000.00, with interest thereon at the rate of 8 per cent per annum, since March 8, 1909; for \$200.00 attorneys' fees, and for costs and disbursements of suit and accruing costs.

2.—That order of sale and execution issue in said suit to the sheriff of Klamath county, Oregon, and that sale be made as on foreclosure, as provided by law, on all of said real property or a sufficient portion thereof to satisfy each of said notes and mortgage and interest thereon; to pay said attorneys' fees; the costs and disbursements of this suit and accruing costs.

3.—That all right, title and interest of the defendants, and each of them, in and to said real property, or any portion thereof sold as aforesaid, be foreclosed as provided by law.

4.—That he be given general relief.

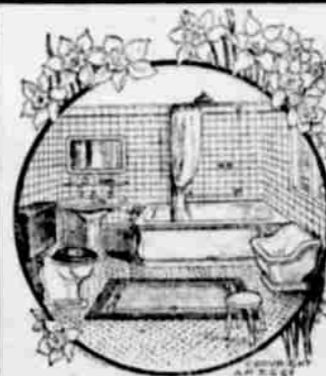
