**Two Japanese Officials Now in California Studying Conditions**



A. Hattori and S. Ebara, the two Japanese officials who have just arrived in California ostensibly to study the alien land question to their own satisfaction, have aroused much interest in the Pacific coast state. Hattori is a former member of parliament, while Ebara is now a senator.  
Hattori is well versed in American ways, having been a student at Princeton University at the time President Wilson was in charge of that institution. He will go to Washington to meet the president before returning to Japan. Ebara, who is 72 years of age, was the first president of the Japanese Peace Society.  
"I hope my visit will lead to a better understanding between my countrymen and the Americans," said he.  
While the purpose of the visit of the two Japanese is accepted generally in California at face value, there is a suspicion on the part of some persons that the Japs may be seeking more information.

**FINN AUTONOMY AGAIN IN PERIL**

**LATEST DUMA DECREE IS TO THE EFFECT THAT FINLANDERS MUST BE TRIED BY THE Czar's MAGISTRATES**

**HELSINGFORS, FINLAND, JUNE 3**  
—The most formidable blow of any of the many aimed at Finnish autonomy in the past few years, in the opinion of all classes here, was the bill brought up in the Russian Duma today at St. Petersburg. The bill requires that all Finns that resist Russian made laws must be tried by a Russian court.  
Introduced by the ministry of justice, the measure is designed to affect all offenses in which bureaucratic ingenuity can discover the slightest semblances of political motives, and includes murder, any attack on police or military, damage done to railways, mails, telegraphs or telephones, the manufacture or sale of bombs, and even any attempt to prevent the application of Russian laws to Finland. The purpose is admittedly to sweep as many Finns as possible into the wide net of Russian law and Russian court procedure. It is even worse than the laws which George III of England evoked against the Colonies previous to the Revolution.

An explanatory statement filed by the ministry was the bill is said to be full of gross misrepresentations, among the most flagrant of which is the assertion that the opposition to "Russification" comes from only a small section of the Finnish people. This is made in the face of the fact that the Finnish Diet, which is one of the most representative and democratic parliaments in the world, is continually and emphatically protesting against various forms of Russian aggression.  
Describing the bill today, the Daily, a leading Liberal organ, in a specially prepared article said: "It means the stealing of Finland's freedom. What remains, for instance, of the freedom of the press, under regulations which can regard any free word as criminal? The ministry of justice evidently desires to level Finland with Russia in the matter of lawlessness, step by step."  
The fate of the measure which came up today lies with the Octobrists, who hold the balance of power in the Duma. How they will vote when the measure reaches that stage, probably the latter part of this week, is as yet problematical.
