## News of Our Neighbors

### Gossip and Progress of Nearby Communities as Chronicled in the Press.

#### Spring, Spring

Abundant and absolutely free mineral water on tap within the city limits was the main subject under discussion at the regular monthly meeting of the Commercial Club. This plan will be adopted in order to make Ashland a notable resort town. Waters of acknowledged therapeutic value are available. Sulphur waters in abundance are already within the city limits. Lithia springs are four miles distant and numerous soda springs are found from three to twelve miles from depot and plaza. Experts have demonstrated the feasibility of piping these waters direct to town, there being enough fall to accomplish this by gravity. Once piped in they will be free to the public through the agency of fountains on the streets and contrivances in the parks which will imitate the natural waters bubbling from the earth's surface.—Ashland Tidings.

#### Cars to Run Soon

In a week or ten days the new electric line will be completed to the Bear Creek bridge and connected with the rails already laid on that structure. The first car made by the St. Louis Car company, with a capacity of fifty passengers, leaves St. Louis today or tomorrow, and will probably arrive here by the first week in December, while everything points to the first car being operated by December 15th.—Medford Sun.

#### All West of Hills

Bearing 250 boosters from the Rogue River Valley, the Southern Oregon Development League special arrived this morning and were met by a local reception committee at the depot headed by the band, and escorted to the opera house, where the greatest get-together meeting in the history of the valley was called to order by Temporary Chairman W. M. Colvig of Medford. Actual count of those aboard the train showed the representation as follows: Ashland 99, Medford 125, Central Point 29, Gold Hill 70, including the brass band, Rogue River 35—the largest delegations ever sent from these cities on a similar mission. From the north came sixteen from Roseburg, twelve from Glendale and smaller delegations from other towns.—Grants Pass Courier.

#### Yreka Buys Bonds

The board of supervisors yesterday unanimously adopted a resolution declaring the intention of Siskiyou county to purchase \$50,000 worth of the state highway bonds at any moment they may be offered. The two Yreka banks at the same time declared their intention of purchasing a like amount of bonds just as soon as the bonds are put on sale. This is done in keeping with the promise made by the Yreka delegation at Sacramento last week in the appeal to the state highway commission asking that the state highway be routed through Yreka instead of Montague. The commission favored Yreka, and now Yreka and Siskiyou county will keep the pledge then made.—Weed Lookout.

#### No Rain, No Lights

The city council listened at its regular meeting Tuesday night to a bit of news that may culminate in a serious problem to the city. Superintendent Butterfield of the electric light department reported that unless we get rain soon there will be a shortage of water in the upper reaches of Ashland creek and the city's hydro-electric power and lighting plant will be seriously handicapped. The city faced a similar condition a year ago last fall, but at that time the load carried by the plant was not so great, and it pulled through. The plant is now heavily loaded, the fall season has been dry, the waters in both forks of Ashland Creek are getting low. Already the plant is drawing on the reservoirs. An early rain would relieve the condition.—Ashland Record.

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## What the Tariff Will Do for Us

### A Careful Study of the New Measure by an Expert

WASHINGTON, D. C., Nov. 10.—There's at least one feature of the new democratic tariff law that is bound to make it immensely popular: if predictions of democrats and admissions by republicans materialize, Democrats predict and republicans admit that it's going to cost quite a bit less than formerly to entertain that world-old visitor who seldom fails to call after supper has served with his bow and arrow. Reference is had to old Dr. Stark, given the most eloquent, extensive and valuable democratic booster of the new tariff refuses to admit that the framers of the bill were looking so far ahead for votes, but however that may be, race outside is given a potential wallop by tax reductions on almost everything which the new arrival must have.

From safety pins to go-carts, the articles the new papa must buy should be cheaper, for the tariff has been greatly lowered. Even calendars, on which are recorded the wondrous doings of the baby, ought to be cheaper. Safety pins are cut 15 per cent, and \$250,000 are expected to be imported next year. Pure Castile soap for the little one's bath can be brought into this country under a 6 per cent import tax reduction. Importations aggregating 5,500,000 pounds are looked for during next year.

Boric acid, a very necessary adjunct in the toilette of Sir Infant—or Lady Infant, as the case may be—may cost 2 cents a pound less than it has formerly. Castor oil, another real necessity, is reduced 22 cents a gallon on the former import tax, and while the retail price will not be greatly lowered, there ought to be enough reduction to help some.

Although the law takes a tax of 2 cents off of fresh condensed milk, there is only a slight chance that this lowering of import duty will be felt by American fathers and mothers still, since to import the stuff may bring down the price of American manufacturers to retailers, there

might be a very slight reduction in total price at that.

Even talcum powder is reduced 5 per cent in the new law. Peppermint oil frequently used to stop colic, ought to be some cheaper, following a slice off the import on that homely remedy, and the tax on mustard—has been lowered enough to permit retail reduction. Even sewing machines for those who like to make the baby clothes can come in duty free. Competition by German, English and Belgian machines is expected to reduce the price on sewing machines considerably.

Duties on everything that goes into the making of go-carts and perambulators also have been reduced low enough to make probable noticeable reductions in retail prices on those necessities.

Resenting the assertion that Sydney, Australia, was the dirtiest town in the Southern hemisphere, the lord mayor has organized a special force of a hundred police for the preservation of good order, cleanliness and neatness.
