CAN SHIP SEEDS BY PARCEL POST

PLANTS, CUTTINGS, ETC., ARE ALL ADMITTED TO FOURTH CLASS MAIL UNDER A NEW RULING JUST MADE

According to information just received by Postmaster W. A. Delzell, seeds, plants, bulbs, roots, scions, etc., can now be sent by parcel post. The postoffice department has just issued an order making these admissible to fourth class mail.

These rates apply whether the seeds, etc., are for planting or any other purpose. This is a great reduction in the rate for transmitting these through the mails.
