The above layout of splendid pictures has just been placed on sale in the form of postcards by the Underwood Drug company. Already the cards are having a big sale, as the collection of photographs of pitching horses is hard to beat.

All of the photographs are copyrighted. They were taken at the last Rodeo by Emmett E. Magee, and several of them have been used by D. Weeks & Co., an English concern, in a world-wide advertising plan. The wide photograph in the center shows the start of a wild horse race, when twenty bronchos, saddled and
