PEACE TALK IS HARD ON PRICES

PRICES JUMP IN NEW YORK WHEN LLOYD GEORGE SAYS ENGLAND REJECTS OFFERS, THEN DROPS AGAIN.

NEW YORK, Dec. 19.—Prices leaped this forenoon following Lloyd George's announcement that the allies will not accept the German peace proposals.

Prices Go Down
NEW YORK, Dec. 19.—The latter part of Lloyd George's speech, leaving the way open for peace if Germany will follow, caused a drop in prices after they had first went up earlier in the day. The same is true in Chicago.
