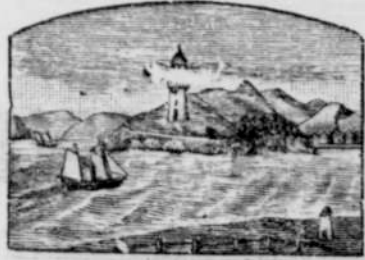

GENERAL NEWS.

CLEANED FROM ALL OVER THE WORLD.

Conveyed in Short and Pithy Paragraphs.

SALEM, Or., Oct. 8.—The 37th annual Oregon state fair closed today. Unlike the last days of other years there was not a general tearing up and removing of exhibits. Everything was required to be kept in place until 11 P. M. tonight, and it was then too late to remove anything. There are no exceptions save in the case of a few head of stock.

The agricultural board held a meeting this morning. It was to ascertain that the amount received during the fair from all sources was \$8250.

The fair was formally closed in the evening by a musical concert and a banquet given by the state board of agriculture.

NEW ORLEANS, Oct. 7.—The fever situation was certainly improved today. There were but two deaths reported up to 6 o'clock tonight. As a matter of fact the situation here is no worse than it has been for some time, and excitement has absolutely disappeared. Now that the disease has shown no symptom of epidemic form, business men are bringing their families back to the city. At 5 o'clock 32 new cases had been reported. The fatal cases were those of Miss Annie Eckel and Miss Pauline Imberner.

LOS ANGELES, Cal., Oct. 7.—W. A. Clark, the Montana millionaire, today purchased the immense Bixby property west of the city, for \$400,000 cash. The property is known as the Curtis ranch, and comprises 8000 acres. Clark will erect a large sugar factory on the property.

MADRID, Oct. 8.—Midnight—The cabinet had decided upon the immediate recall of General Weyler from Cuba. A decree will be issued appointing Captain-General Blanco y Arenas, Marquis of Pena-Plana, governor of the island. The queen regent will sign the decree tomorrow.

According to El Heraldo, 20,000 reinforcements will accompany General Blanco to Cuba.

HAVANA, Oct. 7.—The beautiful, young Cuban patriot, Senorita Evangelina Cassie y Cisneros, heroine of the sensational adventure with the Spanish governor of the Isle of Pines, has escaped from the Casa de Roodiges (house of scrapings), where she had been confined for several months on a charge of conspiracy against the crown of Spain, and of an attempt upon the life of Governor Beres, governor of the Isle of Pines.

At this morning's roll-call, she was missing, and when search was made for her, the attendants found that one of the iron bars of the room in which she had been walled and bent outward. The bar could not have been moved except by a greater outlay of strength, and all the circumstances go to prove the co-operation of outsiders in her escape. Several of the employees of the establishment have been arrested.

PORTLAND, Or., Oct. 11.—The East Side Railway Company's car, Ona, bound for Portland, was held up at Mel-drum station, four miles this side of Oregon City, at 6:45 last evening, by two highwaymen, and from the 35 passengers on board \$97 was taken. Both the robbers were armed with revolvers, each had his face blackened, and each acted with perfect calmness during the robbery. Not a shot was fired by either the robbers or passengers. An absurd civility prevailed, and when the work had been finished the highwaymen bade their victims a courteous adieu and said they would call again when broke. They then backed a short distance into the brush and secreted themselves until the car moved on.
