





SALEM, Or , Oct. 8.—The 37th annua Oregon state fair closed today. Unlike the last days of other years there was not a general tearing up and removing of exhibits. Everything was required to be kept in place until 11 P. M. tonight, and it was then too late to remove unything. There are no exceptions save in

the case of a few head of stock. The agricultural board held a meeting this morning. It was to ascertain that the amount received during the fair from all sources was \$8250.

NEW ORLEANS, Oct. 7 .- The fever situation was certainly improved today. There were but two deaths reported up to 6 o'clock tonight. As a matter of fact the situation here is no worse than it has been for some time, and excitement has absolutely disappeared. Now that the disease has shown no symptom of pidemic form, business men are bringing their families back to the city. At 5 o'clock 32 new cases had been reported.
