Government Lands for Sale.

We are advised by the United States Land Office that on Nov. 27th there will be a public sale of lots and small tracts in the townsite of Siletz, Lincoln County, in the former Siletz Indian Reservation, Oregon.

Our information is that the sale embraces the disposal of 112 lots and 24 five-acre tracts; also a three acre tract for public school purposes.

We are informed that the sale of this land will be the entering wedge to the opening and development of a very fertile country on the Siletz river.

STATE INSTITUTIONS TO RECEIVE BIG SUMS.

Budget Prepared by Board for Next Two Years Totals \$1,752,356.93.

According to final estimates made by the State Board of Control, appropriations required from the next Legislature for the state institutions will total \$1,752,356.93, an increase of \$105,805.32 over the total appropriations made for them by the last Legislature.

Of the amount provided by the last Legislature, \$46,850 was not used, the penitentiary turning \$26,850 back to the general fund, the Soldier's Home turning back \$20,000, making the total appropriation used by institutions, \$1,508,711.61, and making the increase of the estimated appropriations for the total sum used during the present biennium by state institutions.

The total appropriation made for each institution for the years 1913-14 was as follows: Oregon State Hospital for Insane, \$614,353.50; Eastern Oregon Insane Asylum, \$284,829.80; Penitentiary, \$203,500; Feeble-Minded Institution, \$202,243.31; Training School \$73,459; Tuberculosis Sanitarium, \$53,000; Blind School, \$37,235; Deaf School, \$70,950; Girls' School, \$50,000; Soldiers' Home, \$57,000.

The estimated appropriation for each institution for 1915-16 is: Oregon State Hospital for Insane, \$774,711; Eastern Oregon Insane Asylum, \$315,950; Penitentiary, \$188,300; Feeble-Minded Institute, \$155,200; Training School, \$68,395; Tuberculosis Sanitarium, \$69,016; Blind School, \$37,789.18; Deaf School, \$58,776; Girls' School, \$56,875; Soldiers' Home, \$37,348.75.
