Judge Whipple Reviews County History Since Turn of Century

A very good program was enjoyed by those attending the regular meeting of Columbia County Historical society at McBride school Saturday, June 15. The usual good meal was served at noon, with the ladies all helping with hostess duties. Judge J. W. Whipple, first speaker of the afternoon, went back to the beginning of the century to review costs of government as compared with the present day. It was about 1901 and 1902 that the present courthouse was built. County officers listed were headed by Judge J. B. Doan. County commissioners were P. A. Frakes and W. D. Case, and clerk,

J. G. Watts. No Assessor was listed, but Ed Laws stated that Martin White was assessor in 1901, succeeded by Ed Law's father in 1902. County population was 12,000 then, with 15 road districts and 310 miles of roads compared with 664 miles of roads now in six districts. Then there were 56 bridges, compared with 232 now. Comparing costs of bridges, the Scappoose Creek bridge cost \$1731 then, and \$24,000 now. Judge Whipple stated that our present problems are housing and roads. The courthouse is over-crowded, with more space an urgent need, and heavy traffic calls for better road construction to withstand the traffic.

An improved moto-paver has been purchased for cheaper and better road construction, which will pave for \$4000 per mile instead of \$22,000.

Ed Laws spoke on early days, discussing the early newspapers. He stated that the first St. Helens newspaper was the Columbian, then the Oregon Mist. It was changed soon to the St. Helens Mist. Later the Sentinel was started, and the Mist and Sentinel consolidated some years later, becoming the St. Helens Sentinel-Mist. Mr. Laws also told of early fire-fighting, when a bell in a tower on First and Cowlett was used to call volunteer firemen. They had a hand cart which two men dragged to the scene of the fire. He told of a bad fire in 1904, with poor water supply to aid the fighters. \$5.00 per day was paid men building court

house, and he was paid \$1.00 per day to keep wood moving in a flume for cordwood from the hills to the dock.

L. E. Gulker recalled the days of early papers, showing several copies of the Oregon Mist, 1898, and the Nehalem News Journal, published at Pittsburg.

Sumner Bryant from Portland, and a member of the Bryant family of Clatskanie, also spoke, recalling early days in Clatskanie when he was a boy. He told of paying poll tax for road purposes, and a road tax of \$2.50 per year paid for this purpose.
