Both drivers appeared Tuesday before Police Judge Smith. Arrests were made by City Police Officer Frank Lawrence.

Ordered to appear Monday in the police court was Charley Stewart, who was arrested on Oregon's basic rule violation, but he failed to appear. He was arrested after going through the underpass.

Lawrence revealed this week that on Sept. 21 a 17-year-old boy from Ontario was violating city traffic regulations and refused to stop when ordered to do so. The incident occurred at 2:15 a.m. and Lawrence was forced to give chase from the corner of Main and First streets. The youth started back to Ontario at a high rate of speed, ignoring the siren and red signal light. Quarterly Report of 1st National Bank Shows Increase Over Last Year

Figures released by the Nyssa branch of the First National Bank of Portland show that on Sept. 30, 1952, deposits at the branch were \$1,223,479 and loans \$3,375,316. Branch manager George Mitchell made the announcement in keeping with First National's policy of releasing statement of condition figures quarterly.

On Sept. 30, 1952 deposits at First National Bank of Portland, with its 43 statewide banking offices, were \$75,475,827, loans totaled \$303,315,135 and resources amounted to \$630,109,215.
