#### LATEST DISPATCHES.

The Terrible Work of Caban Bandits.

THAT EASTERN SNOW STORM.

Still Raging with Violent Fury and Making Things as Miserable as Possible.

UTICA, N. Y. March 13.-The torm has abated, but an extraordinary fall of snow completely blocks travel. The fast mail and the Atlantic express, due at New York early this morning, are at the depot. No trains arrived to-day and none expected.

NEW YORK, March 13.—There has been only a partial resumption of originally submitted, should be traffic in this city. The elevated adopted for one year on trial. railway trains are running only at intervals wholly inadequate for the requirements. The wind is blowing furiously and the snow is drifting badly, being piled in many places six to nine feet high.

PITTSBURG, March 13.—Business on the Pennsylvania railway between this city and Philadelphia is completely paralyzed. No trains arrived from the east since last night. Everything is blockaded with snow All the trains are snow bound and there is little prospect of their getting out for twenty-four hours.

NEW YORK, March 13.—The stock exchange adjourned at noon to-day. and the loan market at 2:30 p. m. It is reported that several persons perished in the city last night. Communication with points south of New York is entirely cut off. There are no service cars running. The East river is frozen hard this morning, and many Brooklynites walked across it to New York.

NEW YORK, Mar. 13-The storm which commenced to inoderate particulars. about 1 o'clock this morning, broke out with increasing fury a few hours later and it is playing sad havoe on every side.

Brown, consisting of self, wife, six children and hired man, were seated at supper, they were all taken violently sick and in less than an hour Mr. Brown and one child were dead. The others are all very low and it is thought they cannot recover. It is believed they were poisoned by some vile assassin. The matter is being investigated.
