PACIFIC COAST NAVAL STATION.

Admiral Porter Endorses Senator Mitchell's Coast Defense Scheme.

Washington, March 21.-In reference to the resolution presented in the senate a few days ago by Senator Mitchell, of Oregon, providing for the appointment of a commission, to be composed of three competent naval officers, whose duty it should be to make a careful examination of the North Pacific coast and select a site for a naval station, Admiral Porter, first admiral of the navy, has written a letterto Senator Mitchell endorsing the proposition to establish strong and complete navy yard and station at Port Townsend, on Puget Sound.

The secretary of the navy, while approving of the manner in which the work is to be done, gives little encouragement to the scheme.

Au Ohio Boy Wins an English Scholar-

COL. J. B. MONTGOMERY

Interviewed in New York on the Political Situation.

NEW YORK, March 20.-Colonel J. B. Montgomery, of Portland, Oregon, is in the city. In speaking of California, he said the advancement of that state is like a page taken from the Arabian Nights. About the political situation, he says that if there is to be a dark horse in the republican convention, the Pacific Coast states will vote for General Miles, and if the republicans nominate a pro-Chinese candidate he cannot earry the Pacific Coast and slope. Blaine, he says, leads all competitors for popular favor on the republican side. Sugar Surplus,

SAN FRANCISCO, March 20.-The American Sugar Refinery Company has chartered the ship Arabia at the reported rate of \$4.50 per short ton to load a cargo of raw sugar for New York. She will load at once, and as she is quite large, the vessel registering 2024 tons, she will be able to take away about 3000 tons of the expected surplus of 60,000 tons.

The Swalm-McDonald Case. SAN FRANCISCO, March 20.-The prosecution made the opening statement to-day in the case of Seneca Swalm, charged with appropriating \$3850 worth of jewelry belonging to Clara Belle McDonald's husband. The attorney said he proposed to show that improper conduct had existed between Swalm and Mrs. Me-Donald in Los Angeles and in this city, and that Swalm's whole object was to plunder Clara Belle.

New Freight Schedule, San Francisco, March 20.-The traffic manager of the Pacific mail company is still engaged in the preparation of a new freight schedule which is to govern the shipment of merchandise to and from all Central American and Mexican ports over the company's lines. He contemplates advancing the rate from 5 to 10 per cent, and when the new rate sheet is issued it is the intention that it shall be permanent. It will go into effect before the 25th inst.
