LIGHTNING STRIKES THE CAPITOL

Senators and Congressmen Thrown into Tremor and Confusion by the Shock.

A MOST TERRIFIC CRASH.

Which Shakes the Massive Marble Structure and Creates a Panic---Two Men Prostrated.

WASHINGTON, March 22.-The national capitol was struck by lightning yesterday afternoon suddenly. First there was a blinding flash, followed instantly by a report like the explosion of a bombshell over the building. Such was the terrific force of the stroke that it shook the vast marble structure and rattled the windows in all parts of the streaks along the telegraph and electrie light wires and steam heating pipes, causing a complete panie fol among the employes in the building. The report was so deafening as to cause a temporary cessation of business in both houses of congress. Senators and members of the house jumped to their feet in terror, and some little time elapsed before order Josephine Klamath could be restored in the house. In the basement of the capitol two laborers were prostrated by the shock, but both soon recovered. All were destroyed except one.
