THE TAX ON LUMBER.

The tax on lumber is engaging a good share of public attention, and to get at the merits of this impost it is well to listen to the testimony of those who are best able to throw light on the question. The Chicago Lumberman says:

Some effort is devoted by which lumber will be laid there in the developing towns of Southern California at a reasonable price, the claim being that the lumbermen, instead of being absent of the times, have stuck to the same old price which predominated when it cost a small fortune to get a cargo of lumber to an interior town—that they have not kept pace with reductions in freight rates. The present price of lumber in Southern California is believed to be unduly unwarmed by its first cost and the expense of buying it down of local parties, and are thus rendering building and keeping back development.

The Los Angeles Times has been ventilating this lumber question with luminous energy and other papers in the same region have joined in the outcry. The high price of lumber, these journals assert, is a main cause of the set back in the price of city property. The prices of the various kinds of dimension lumber they complain of an exorbitant; that this exorbitance leads to high rents, and they declare there is no inducement to a laboring man, or one of moderate means, even, to go to a booming town to live.

A week or so ago we published the statement of the San Francisco correspondent of the New York Tribune, who tells of the pine lumber pool, a sort of trust, as he states it, who have succeeded the last year in advancing the price of lumber from \$12 to \$14 per thousand feet. "This pool," the writer says, "has simply made the people of California pay about \$1,500,000 into its pocket. It controls ships and mills, and regulates the price of pine lumber to suit itself."

With these facts before us the talk of a tax on lumber to protect home producers is simply absurd. Indeed the Oregonian meets this demand with the following strong argument:

The lumbermen of this country, so far as their views have found expression, care nothing one way or another about the question of free lumber. The business here is so well adjusted upon the proper basis of supply and demand that they have no fear of competition with British Columbia. In any event there is no danger of over supply or reduced price. But in the old northwest there is much division of sentiment. Lumbermen are opposed to removal or reduction of the tariff because, they frankly say, it will bring Canadian lumber into the country and reduce the price. From the point of view of the consumers of lumber, who outnumber the
