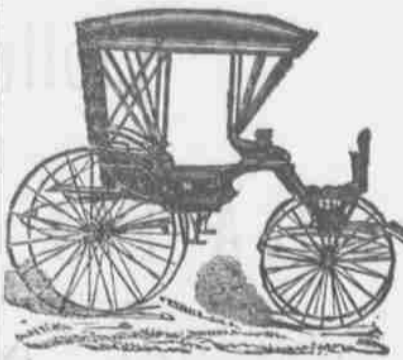

STATE NEWS.

Land near Independence produces 500 bushels of onions per acre.

The Oregon Pacific company lately purchased two new steamers in New York.

The idea of extending the West Side road to Junction City is being revived.

There is talk of another flouring mill for Klamath county soon, to be built at or near Keno.

Assessor Gray reported an increase in Josephine county's taxable property for 1888 of over \$100,000.

Jim Westfall, the Chinese contractor, has gone to San Francisco to secure 300 Chinese laborers to work on the Oregon Pacific.

President Stanley will have the Observer office, at Monmouth, remodeled for a dining hall. It can be arranged so as to seat nearly 100 students.

Spuds are in the market in large quantities, at bottom prices. They can be bought readily at 30 cents per sack, and in many instances can be had at any price offered.—Transcript.

John M. Simpson, residing four miles south of Hillsboro, threshed 1300 bushels of New Zealand oats from 15 acres. One field of 52 acres averaged 70 bushels to the acre.—Independent.

The Southern Oregon Co's. mill at Empire cut 78,760 feet of lumber one day lately, and did it easily. It must be remembered that only half the mill is being run at present, and the result is more than satisfactory.—Coos Bay News.

Senator Dolph has been notified by the postmaster-general that a mail service twice a week from Fossil and Wagner to Monument will be put on October 1, and that the service will be increased to six times a week from North Yamhill to Holstonville.

Grant's Pass academy opened Monday and has enrolled 200 scholars. Prof. Benson was much surprised to see so many new comers who have settled here from the following points since school was dismissed last spring: Dakota, Wisconsin, Minnesota, Kansas, Washington territory, Idaho, Montana.
