

WASHINGTON, Dec. 5,-Senator Quay has decided to make a fight in the courts for the electoral vote of Virginia which he believes honestly belongs to the republicans. Thats all there is about it, and good citizeus everywhere should give him their moral support in his efforts to secure an honest count of the vote cast in Virginia. He Didn't Sign It.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 5.-The President did not sign a bill which was sent to him in the last days of the last session of Congress.
