They are Charles N. Felton, of SanFrancisco, present representative from the Fifth district of that State, and Joseph N. Dolph, Senator from Oregon.

Senator Dolph would make an admirable Secretary of the Interior, but his chances for continuing in his present position are so good that he would doubtless be reluctant to resign the Senatorship to go into Harrison's Cabinet.
