

LATE HOP NEWS.

Review of the situation in Oregon and Washington.

No shipments have been made from Puyallup during the week.

Noticing doing and local quotations cannot be made.

H. E. McGowan bought of J. M. Ogé, Bucoo, 37 bales of hops for New York market.

Lice is now prevalent everywhere in Washington and spraying is going on in all the well kept yards.

H. E. McGowan purchased from F. Snyder, McMillan, 28 bales of hops on Tuesday and shipped same via Great Northern to New York.

C. H. Ross of Puyallup, is pruning the leaves off the bottom of the vines and trimming. He is also making preparations to spray immediately as the lice are increasing.

Washington growers have made a number of contracts at 8 cents. The growers figure that contracting a portion of their crop at this price will insure picking money and that they are on the safe side of any chances of a totally demoralized market at the incoming of the new crop.

In well tilled Puyallup yards the vines are making a rapid growth and in low lying bottom much yards, where the cold weather has retarded growth, the vines are now making somewhat of a showing. In many of the trellis yards there is a complete reaching of vine from pole to pole, and sturdy arms are growing rapidly.

But a large proportion of the Washington yards, says the Puyallup Citizen, are showing a woeful neglect and this condition prevails throughout Oregon and Washington. Unless many of the growers are encouraged by better quotations, large acreages will go unsprayed and the result will cause a loss propagation beyond anything ever experienced in any district. Many of the growers are in such desperate financial circumstances that they cannot buy spraying material, while others are leaving undone all the work that cannot be accomplished without hiring help.

If conditions threatened by the present outlook prevail at picking time, a majority of the growers will be compelled by force of circumstances, to abandon the industry, and over half the acreage of Western Washington and a good third of the acreage of Oregon, must be plowed under or abandoned—unless the holdings are transferred to new growers who are financially able to cope with the circumstances. But this is not likely as hope is rapidly becoming an uninviting field for investors.
