ISSUE OF MONEY.

Congress alone has the power to coin and issue money, and Prerident Jackson declared that this power could not be delegated to corporations or individuals. INCOME TAX. Until the money question is settled we are opposed to any agitation for further changes in our tariff laws, except such as are necessary to meet the deficit in revenue caused by the adverse decision of the supreme court on the income tax. But for this decision by the supreme court there would be no deficit in the revenue under the law passed by a Democratic congress in strict pursuance of the uniform deci-sions of that court for 100 years, that court having in that decision sustained constitutional objections to its enactment which had preciously been overruled by the ablest judges who have ever sat on the bench. We declare that it is the duty of congress to use all the constitutional power which remains after that decision, or which may come from its reversal by the court as it may hereafter be constituted, so that the burdens of taxation may be equally and impartially laid, to the end that wealth may bear its due proportion of the expense of the government.

LABOR. We hold that the most efficient way of protecting American labor is to prevent the importation of foreign pauper labor to compete with it in the home market, and that the value of the home market to our American farmers and artisans is greatly reduced by a vicious monetary system which depresses the prices of their products below the cost of production, and thus deprives them of the means of purchasing the products of our home manufactories, and, as labor creates the wealth of the country, we demand the passage of such laws as may be

necessary to protect it in all its rights. We are in favor of the arbitration of differences between employers en gaged in interstare commerce their employes, and recommend such egislation as is necessary to carry out his principle.

The absorption of wealth by the few, the consolidation of our leading railroad systems, and the formation of trust and pools require a sticter control by the federal government of those arteries of commerce.
