The constitution allows members 10 cents a mile each way for attending the legislature, and it is only where members propose various junketing trips in the name of visiting committees that the nursance becomes appalling.

Mr. Moorhead reported the mile age for the house members. He was chairman of the committee. Of course his committee had to have a clerk during the entire session, although that would go on a sheet of foolscap paper.

It is notorious that with few exceptions members of the legislature of 1895 passed free over the railroads and paid no fare during the entire session. The same legislature appropriated the sums below to pay the mileage of its members. The great bulk of this money went into the pockets of the legislators. The figures in detail makes interesting reading for the struggling taxpayer. They show that mileege was drawn in 1895 as follows:

The senate drew mileage to the amount of that the president, who of all men would not be without a pass, who was only a member of the committee on rules, drew \$95.60. His constitutional mileage would have been \$10.80. Mr. Simon may have been on some visiting committee, but that is unusual. The thirty senators cost for mileage \$74.10 each.

The sixty members of the house drew \$3,374.30 mileage, or \$62.37 each. The total mileage drawn by house and senate was \$5,967.40. The speaker of the house drew 60 cents mileage and seems to have been on no visiting committees that cost any mileage.
