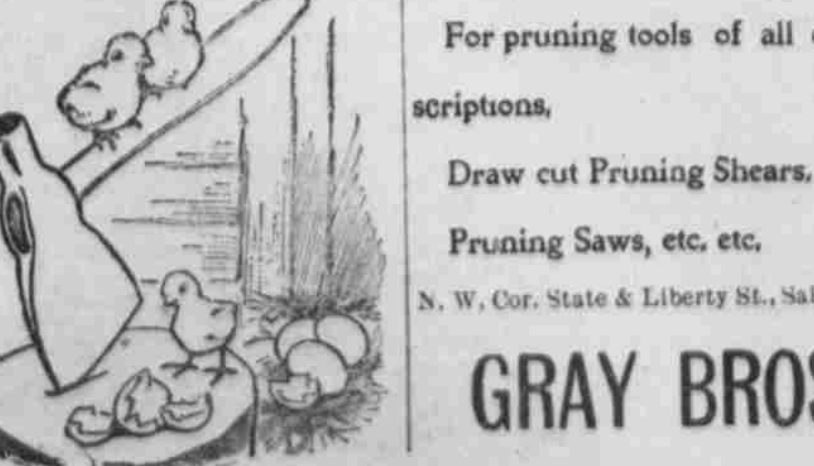

Peace Now Assured.

Treaty Signed by the Queen of Spain. Climax Very Nearly Reached in the Philippines.

Hostilities are Reported Almost at an End there Now.

By Associated Press to the Journal. MADRID, March 17.—The queen regent has signed the treaty of peace.

WASHINGTON, March 17.—In the absence of direct diplomatic communication between the United States and Spain, Secretary Hay expects to receive formal notice of the ratification of the peace treaty by the Queen Regent through the medium of the French embassy.

CLASH ON PORCUPINE RIVER. Pitted Battle Between American and Canadian Miners—Four Killed.

NEW YORK, March 17.—A special dispatch to the World from Vancouver, B. C., says: Carl Stummerfelt, a passenger on board the steamer Tees, which has arrived from the Lynn canal, brought the news that a battle had been fought between American and Canadian miners, a few miles off the Dalton trail, four men are reported to have been killed outright, and a number of others are said to have been seriously wounded.

When the alien mining law of British Columbia was enforced a few months ago, the American miners left Atlin. They found, a short distance off the Dalton trail, on the Porcupine river, a district rich in placer gold.

A fortnight ago, about 100 American miners held a meeting and decided to send notice to the Canadians to leave the country within four days.

After further debate, the general discussion was closed, and the articles of the army bill were defeated. Article 1, which the committee did not alter, was adopted; articles 2, as drafted by the committee and amended by Dr. Lieber's motion was adopted.

It transpired during the day that Dr. Lieber's motion was the result of the negotiations between Dr. Lieber and Count von Posadowsky-Wohler and Prince Hohenlohe, the imperial chancellor, who both agreed to recommend the compromise of the bundesrath.
