RENSBURG, Jan. 5 .- Colesberg has not pectedly attacked the British left at daybreak this morning but were repulsed. They still hold the hills immediately surrounding the town, preventing the British from advancing along the rail-

The British loss today was light, while the Boers are reported to have lost 100, including 20 prisoners taken by the mounted infantry. The Boer attackers numbered 1,000 men. The Inviskilling dragoons cut their way through the Boers, who were forced to retreat by the heavy artillery and musketry fire.


