ARE NOW IN NEW QUARTERS

W. C. T. U. Dedicated Their Hall Yesterday

Sunday was a day for rejoicing for the ladies of the Salem W. C. T. U. It was the occasion of the dedication of their new home in The Journal building, at the corner of Ferry and Commercial streets. The dedication of the temple at this time falls on the twentieth anniversary of the organization of the Salem W. C. T. U. This anniversary will be appropriately celebrated during the year.

The accommodations of the hall were not sufficient to seat the large audience that assembled to join the ladies in their service of praise. Mrs. Steele, president of the Marion county W. C. T. U., presided at the service, which commenced at 4 o'clock in the afternoon. The principal dedicatory address was delivered by Rev. W. C. Kantner, of the First Congregational church. This address was preceded by scriptural reading by Rev. H. A. Ketchum, of the Presbyterian church, and prayer by Revs. Royal, Cliffe and Crawford. Rev. Kantner stated, in opening his remarks, that he considered the building being dedicated to the use of the W. C. T. U. is eminently adapted to the purpose for which it is to be used. He congratulated the ladies on the fact that instead of being a resort for the routing of men's souls and bodies, the building would now be adapted to counteracting the destructive influences it had exerted in the past. An improvement was noticed, said the speaker, when the saloon that formerly occupied the building was succeeded by a creamery, which, instead of distributing liquid damnation, produced that which sustains and nourishes life. The speaker thought the hall should properly be termed a temple, that in its dedication should first be dedicated to God. He understood the W. C. T. U. to be a union between Christian women and God. The service also included a dedication of the hall to man, he said, since the work that is being carried on by the members of the organization is both for man, and is humane; the hall should also be dedicated to the reform influences for which the W. C. T. U. stands. Being dedicated for these purposes, said the speaker, the building should be a God center—a center of force and power from which God's influence may be felt in the social life of the community.

After a vocal solo by Mrs. Charlton, Rev. John Parsons followed with some additional remarks, in which he congratulated the local union on the evolution they had produced in the building they now occupy—in transferring it from a saloon to a hall in which to carry on their noble work. He stated that the members of the W. C. T. U. are creating a temperance conscience that will eventually overthrow the saloons and wipe out the gambling hell from the land. Rev. Parsons then officiated in taking a thank offering for the ladies to apply on the indebtedness against the local union, amounting to about \$1100. Nearly \$100 was raised in voluntary subscriptions.
