London, June 3 .- Lloyds today re eived a dispatch from Valparaiso re porting the loss of the Pacific Steam Navigation Company's steamer Aroquiah, with 80 aboard, including passengers and crew. The dispatch adds that several large and scores of small boats, were wrecked in the harbor during the gale of the last two days, and the city of Valparaiso suffered considerable damage.


