Kahuna Thumps his Patient to Death With it in Trying to Drive out Devils

trial on a charge of manslaughter. As briefly told in a previous dispatch, he is charged with having caused the death of an old native by beating him over the head with a libbe in order to

drive the devils from his body.

The case is one of the most unique in the annals of kahunaism in the islands. It appears from the story told at the trial in the district court that a native in the Puna district became ill. and the government physician, Dr. Holland, was called in. He was treating the man, with some hope of curing him, when the native called in a kahuna, believing that the physician was na, believing that the physician was not curing him rapidly enough. The kahuna immediately threw away the remedies prescribed by the physician and diagnosed the case for himself. He found that the man was possessed of red devils, and after several incaptations, in which the aid of the spirits was invoked, decided that the only was invoked, decided that way to strive out the devils was by the liberal application of the Bible to the head of the patient. The sick man was compelled to sit opright in his bed and was then beaten vigorously by the kahnna with a heavy volume of the Scriptures. When the kahuna's arm tired, the man's wife was forced to continue the treatment until the man sank unconscions in bed. A few days afterward the man was besten oven more vigirously with the Bible, and he

afterward the charge was changed to manslaughter. The man made no dewere red, that he was restless of the Bible to the head, as the Bible

The Kahuna was asked to point to the chapter in the Scriptures which provided for this method of getting rid of the devil, but he became confused and rafused to do so. Judge Kamau then held the kahuna for the grand jury on the charge of manslaughter. The wife of the man admitted that she The wife of the man admitted that she had beaten her husband over the head with the Bible, but said that she could

with the Bible, but said that she could not disobey the instructions of the kahunai, in whom she trusted implicitly.

This case has caused an investigation to be made of the practice of kahunaism in the islands. Kahunaism is prohibited by law. It is a role of ancient Hawaii, and all the efforts of the missionaries, from the day of their arrival, have been insufficient to stample but even some of the educated people among the Hawaiians believe in it. The kahuna has of late become somewhat modernized, or perhaps it is only that fakirs have replaced the real thing. Many of them are blackmailers, thing. Many of them are blackmailers, pure and simple. They claim power to summon spirits at will, and unless they receive everything they want in the form of money or food the credulous native is likely to suffer from their wiles. The kahunas claim descent from the devil, and the principal theory of their practice is that all men are possessed of spirits, which leave their bodies at night and pester other people; also that spirits of deceased relatives always return to earth to inflict their presence upon people they flict their presence upon people they have known in life. The kahuna, for a small consideration, kills these wan-dering spirits and permits the native to go in peace. Pigs and white chick-ens must be sacrificed to obtain this. The man who is inflicted with the spirits must provide the chickens and pigs

The kahuna also claims the power of praying a person to death, and it is not infrequent that cases are reported. infrequent that cases are reported, too, where these witches are employed for this purpose. Journal: While the fee system with our sheriffs seemed to contain all the defects possible, yet under that expensive system we have a better games and refreshments, and the Portrecord of capturing escaped criminals and fuglives than under the present laws placing sheriffs on salary. The present indolence, inertia and lethar gic condition prevailing in Portland police and detective circles lliustrates the law of salary to a nicety. people howl for the capture of the (and the consequent risk of getting shot besides) for a stated sum every month. Now, it is bard to convince most men that the risk is always worth the salary. Offer these same men a reward, a good-sized purse, and the risk becomes a matter of second ary importance. In other words give them a fee system, and we will find more energy and stimulus in hunting down criminals. As it now exists, a man gets \$75 a month for collecting the taxes, a job, as we all know, that is once in a while a very dangerous one. He gets \$75 for attending to the other duties of serving papers, etc. Then, if a desperate criminal appears he is supposed to forget his wife and babies and plunge late the trap laid for him and be murdered, all for \$75 a month. Now the arguments rise up that, if he doesn't intend doing his duty, he it as it may, what does he accept the office for? This argument bear more than their proportion of the burden of taxation if the ordinance is caforced. Efforts are being made to secure a change in the ordinance and fireaide and his own life when the weight in the other scale is \$75 a month. Could the wife and cupboard fare well with this \$75? If the sheriff loses his life when the reward is in the thousands of dollars, he leaves his widow and orphans a ready and avail able competence. We are all human, and it is natural and not to our shame either, to think of our own selves and those dependent first. How many criminals are worth the life of just one sheriff?
