HOP NEWS FROM ABROAD

General Condition of American and European Yards Outlined

The Waterville, New York, Times compiles the following authentic hop news from every hop center in the world. It says:

Receipts for week 236 bales.
Receipts from September 1 100,280 bales.

Receipts same time last year 81,482 bales.

Exports to Europe for week none.

Exports from September 1 46,683 bales.

Exports for same time last year 35,557 bales.

Imports from September 1 4972 bales.

Imports same time last year 12,541 bales.

The market has not been very active the past week, owing to smallness of remaining stock and firm views of holders. Brewers are buying some, which is not to be wondered at, as the government report for June just issued shows an increase in the output of beer of 700,000 barrels over June, 1903, which is regarded as remarkable. The crop in New York state is doing as well as heretofore and everything looks favorable. In all three Coast states reports are satisfactory as to growing crops. Dealers are still endeavoring to contract on the Coast, but meet with little success as growers are not inclined to sell. From England reports show no improvement as it appears as if the washing and spraying had both been unsuccessful in stemming the ravages of vermin and mold. From Germany reports indicate that owing to rains there, has been an improvement in the situation there and speak well of the coming crop.

Chicago, Aug. 17.—The Chicago and Great Western engine crashed into a loaded electric car and two trailers bound for the Hawthorne race track at 1:30 o'clock p. m. Eight were killed and 16 injured while the cars were demolished.

The crash occurred at 48th street and Colorado avenue. The train was the Milwaukee express and struck the middle trailer. The flagman signalled the motorman to stop but he couldn't control the brakes. The motor man was killed and two conductors were arrested. The neighboring police stations were notified and ambulances were rushed to the scene. Three of the dead are women.

Coal Yards Burning.
Chefoo, Aug. 17.—A report from Port Arthur says that the Japanese have captured a position at Palichuang three miles from the fortress. The coal yards were ignited by Japanese shells and are burning.

YANKEES WELCOME VETERANS

Boston Mass., Aug. 17.—Today was devoted to business by the Grand Army veterans and the members of the affiliated organizations in annual session. Despite the fatigues of yesterday's march the veterans were astir early and Mechanics' building was well crowded an hour before the national encampment was called to order. The session was opened with prayer by the chaplain-in-chief, Winfield Scott of Arizona. After addresses of welcome and other formalities had been disposed of the veterans listened to the annual address of Commander-in-Chief Black and the reports of the Adjutant-General, Charles A. Partridge, and the other officers of the national organization.

The Woman's Relief Corps held its initial session this morning in Tremont temple with the national president, Mrs. Sarah Wynans of Troy, N. O., presiding. Other organizations which began their annual meetings at the same time were the Sons of Veterans, ladies of the G. A. R. and Ladies Aid society.

One of the novel entertainment features of the week takes place tonight at Waltham, where a grand water carnival will be held on the Charles river. Four or five thousand canoes will be employed to make continuous lines of red fire along a two mile stretch of the river, while the veterans and their friends will witness the spectacle from the river bank.
