STATE NEWS

The Salem Military Band has been engaged to play at the Lewis and Clark fair.

Hop growers near Eugene have recently shipped large shipments of hop plants to California. One man shipped 100,000 plants the past week.

Mrs. Mary Barr, an inmate of the poor farm located near Hillsboro, died last week from burns received by putting wood into the stove, when her clothing caught fire. She had been an inmate for 12 years.

Stanley Ray, a Corvallis boy, aged 14, shot himself through the arm while out hunting.

A bill is being prepared in Corvallis for bonding the town for \$75,000 for a water plant. It will be presented to the present legislature.

The town of Jefferson has decided to issue bonds for \$12,000 for a water and light plant.

The enrollment at the O. A. C. is the largest in the history of that institution, being 600.

Lillienthals Win.

Lillienthal Bros. were awarded a verdict of \$6000 in Portland Wednesday in their suit against Dave Dove and H. Hirschberg, brought in the United States court. Lillienthal Bros. sued for \$6000, alleging the same to be due by reason of the failure of the defendants to comply with the terms of a hop contract.

The evidence of the plaintiff showed that a contract had been entered into for the purchase and sale of hops, and that it was provided in the contract that delivery should be made by defendants upon receipt of ten days' notice by the plaintiff. The notice, it was alleged, had been given by a letter sent through the mails. The defendants testified that they had never received such notice, and were therefore under no obligation to make delivery of the hops.

The preponderance of evidence was on the side of plaintiffs, however, and a verdict returned in their favor.—Oregonian.
