ACROSS THE CONTINENT

In the annual report published on Saturday over the signature of the president of the Denver & Rio Grande Railroad company some interesting information is given concerning the plans of the Western Pacific, the line that is to be built from Salt Lake City to San Francisco and that will connect the Wabash system with the Pacific Coast. The report explains that control of the Southern Pacific by the Union Pacific places obstacles in the way of the Gould system in securing traffic from the Coast extension of the Southern Pacific road. The rapid development of the commercial agricultural and industrial interests on the Pacific coast and the increase of commerce with the Philippines, China and Japan led to the investigation of the feasibility of an independent line.

The surveys have been completed on this San Francisco extension. An exceptionally favorable gradient has been secured through the Sierra Nevada range of mountains, the slope being only 52.8 feet to the mile on each side of the range. Concerning the general advantages of the route it is affirmed that it is "superior to any existing line to the California coast." It is "confidently anticipated" that the link from Salt Lake to San Francisco will be completed within the next three years.

The completion of this Western link will afford the Gould system the shortest and easiest outlet from the coal and iron district of Colorado to the Pacific, just as the scheme on the East, to link up with the Western Maryland, will afford the shortest and easiest outlet to the Atlantic from the vast iron and steel factories of the Pittsburgh district. In addition, the completion of both the Eastern and Western links will constitute the Gould route the most direct line from ocean to ocean and the only route that is entirely under one control all the way from the Atlantic to the Pacific Coast. Without a change of cars it will be possible, when the two links have been completed, to travel entirely across the continent from Baltimore to San Francisco. The quickest passenger service to the Pacific Coast, even for travelers from Boston, New York, or Philadelphia, will most likely be by the way of Baltimore when the two ocean links of the Gould transcontinental system shall have been completed.

While the Western link is free from complications as to right of way, the construction work to be accomplished is much greater than pertains to the Eastern link. Three years is the time allowed for completing the Pacific connections, and recently George Gould, while not explaining details, said that the connection from Pittsburg with the Western Maryland would be finished within eighteen months. There is, therefore, a fair assurance that within three years the transcontinental railway system from Baltimore to San Francisco will be in complete operation.—Baltimore American.
