HUSTON HAS A RECORD

Bedrock Republican Says Tooze Alone Is It

When it Comes to Comparing Notes as to Loyalty to Principles

Editor Journal: I have been a life-long Republican, but am one of the kind who do not swallow everything, but have never bolted the national part of my ticket. I shall support the Republican nominee for congress and for the U. S. senate, whoever he may be. National Republican principles are to me dear as the apple of my eye, especially as interpreted by Teddy Roosevelt. If he wins out on his rate bill, and that law is as successful as we hope, it will be, no one can stop him from being President again. I have recently written to Washington county, where one of the Republican aspirants for congress resides, when not attending to his law business in Portland. I got very little useful information, but learned the following facts:

That in 1890 Mr. Huston was defeated in the Republican county convention in Hillsboro by Judge Crandal for the nomination of county judge. He then came into the Democrat county convention, sought and obtained a nomination in the legislature, but was defeated at the election. In 1892 the Democrats gave him the nomination for state senator, but he was defeated by Hon. Tom Tongue. In 1896 the Democrats again nominated him for state senator—Thomas Tongue being the Republican nominee. While Tongue was gone to the national convention as a delegate, Huston canvassed the county and with the aid of the Southern Pacific and united Populist vote he was elected. While in the senate he voted to repeal the mortgage tax law and made a stronger free silver speech in nomination of Judge A. S. Bennett for U. S. senator than ever Silver Dick Bland made anywhere or at any time. In 1896 he ran on a free silver Democrat ticket, declaring from the stump that he would support John H. Mitchell and none other for senator, and when the Presidential election of 1896 came he stopped over and canvassed for McKinley. His radical free silver nominating speech was preserved by Long, the Argus man, and I asked Long the other day to let me see it, as I wanted to reread it, and he told me that he had loaned it to the chairman of the Republican state campaign committee so as the committee could keep Huston off the stump as a general speaker. But did allow him to make three speeches in Washington county, and they never returned it to Long.

I have been contending that the Hon. Walter L. Tooze was the only Republican in the race for the congressional nomination who was entitled to any consideration at the hands of straight Republicans. For 20 years he has not deviated in his support of the ticket, and when Huston was chasing free silver, Tooze was almost alone among the leaders in this county who went forth to battle for the cause of sound money. He stood up and was counted and was on the right side then as he has always been. At the great Lincoln banquet at Salem when he and others who want to go to congress stood up and told us what they knew about Republicanism he alone struck fire for protection, sound money and the heroes of the Grand Army. Huston and Hawley forgot about the bedrock principles of Republicanism and the patriotic rank and file that have made the Republican party great and this nation what it is. He alone is entitled to the ballot of straight men who stand on the national principles of the party and he has stood to his guns through the thick of the fight on all occasions. Do not be afraid to let the rank and the file know that.

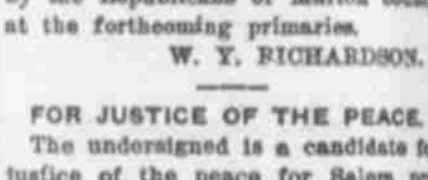
