

DON'T WANT TO PLAY

Not in Salem's Back Yards Unless There Is a Cleaning Up

Ed. Journal:—A prominent citizen of Salem, during a recent conversation with the writer, called attention to the numerous wooden shacks and backdoor buildings scattered around town in the rear of our business blocks. Several hundreds of these buildings are located within the fire limits and are a constant menace to the property adjacent. Some are partially protected by the use of corrugated iron roofs and sides but most of them carry several inches of good, thick moss for roofing. Around these scattered buildings are all sorts of refuse and old cast off fixtures, boxes, and a general assortment of store rubbish, which ought to have been either burned or carted to the dump ground. Alternately soaked by the rain and heated by the sun, these germ breeding stacks of junk are rapidly falling into a putrescent state. Not only as a matter of hygienic expediency, but as a matter of pride the merchants should spend an occasional day among the boxes and refuse in the back yard and clean things up. Salem is now large enough for her business street alleys to be constantly used as thoroughfares. People are daily using alleys for short cuts, not only to saloons, but from one street to another and half of these alleys are without walks and the pedestrian must take to the mud. At night they are dark and forbidding and in the secret places might lurk the unseen hand of the footpad ready to strike down the unsuspecting. A row of incandescent lamps strung throughout our alleys would be a boon to the "short-cutters" and an aid to the nightwatch. More fires originate in these places than anywhere else, therefore why not enforce cleaning-up laws.

Some time ago a young real estate agent came to Salem from the Yakima valley, in the state of Washington for the avowed purpose of selling land to the Willamette valley farmers. He was and is yet trying to persuade them that they can sell out here and go to Yakima and get rich growing apples.

As an object lesson, the young man rented a show window from John Hughes on State street and arranged a splendid display of Washington grown apples.

Mr. Hughes and his able assistants, whose fertile brains are always working, cleared out the other window of the store and established a rival apple show. The exhibits they fixed up of Marion county apples took all the shine off the Washington exhibit.

The young promoter from the Evergreen state sent back to Yakima for a better exhibit and his people shipped him a fresh consignment of apples but it was no use. Marion county kept in the lead by a whole head and neck.

Now, it is proposed that the Marion county farmers send a small exhibit of Marion county grown apples to Yakima and Mr. Lafore says it will be done. One Marion county farmer has volunteered to meet all the expense if necessary.
