Sixteen hundred untamed cayuses up corrals on the Switzler ranch just side of the river. The annual roundup is now on in full swing and hundreds of the unbroken range horses are being gathered together for the purposes of segregation and sale to the highest bidder.

A large number of buyers are on hand to bid for the animals as soon as the bands of the different owners are separated from each other. They will be bid for in carload lots and most of them shipped east.
