These are not unreanonable provisions. These corporations are prop-
erly chargeable with street improvements. The gross earnings tax is very small, $\$ 20$ on the $\$ 1000$ collected as fares,
The demand that they shall give a bond for a rasonable time limit
as to when they shall be constructed is also right and IN THE TRUE INTEREST OF THE CITY.
To tie up this elty and its streets for many years with franchises that are merely
