Most Remarkable Case in All Medical History.

What local physicians look upon as the most remarkable case in medical history was revealed this week by the autopsy following the death of Mrs. Stevens, who has lived for months with a hole in her heart, through which the blood leaked out. According to all the laws of science this trouble, the first of its kinds to be recorded, ought to have caused death as soon as it begun. Mrs. Stevens was literally the sickest person on record, suffering in addition to the heart trouble, which carried her off, for which a name has not yet been chosen, from at least six other deadly disease to say nothing of many minor ones. How she lived at all is a mystery. Although but 33 years old the list of her troubles sounds like a medical dictionary. At the time of her death she was suffering from Bright's disease, cirrhosis of the liver, tuberculosis, pachymeningitis, dropsy of the whole body and general eczema or puffiness of the brain. In addition to these any of which should have caused death, were a list of minor complaints making her literally a museum of maladies.
