MEETING PACIFIC COAST STATES.
From report from Washington convey the news that the senators and representatives in congress from the Pacific coast states are devising a plan where THEY CAN WORK IN UNISON FOR ALL MEASURES AFFECTING THIS COAST REGION.
This is in furtherance of the ideas that have been advanced by Rufus F. Jennings, for the last five years chairman of the California Promotion committee.
He has advocated a political and commercial alliance of the Pacific coast states, and has made public addresses and written numerous magazine and newspaper articles on the subject, outlining a combination throughout this region similar to the California Promotion committee and its affiliated commercial organization in California.
That such a movement would be of vast benefit to the Pacific coast goes without saying, and the combination of the western representatives is the first step TOWARD THE CONSUMMATION OF THE IDEA ADVANCED BY MR. JENNINGS.
With this beginning toward such an organization it would be timely now for all the commercial organizations in Washington, Oregon, California, Nevada, Utah, Idaho and Arizona to get together and make the combination complete.
Chairman Jennings has written the following letter to all of the senators and congressmen from these states and territories:
"I note by the press reports from Washington that the members of the United States senate and house of representatives, from the Pacific coast states in the national congress, are combining to work for the common interest of this part of the country.
I desire to be of whatever service may be in my power TO MAKE SUCH A COALITION OF FORCES EFFECTIVE, for it has been my aim for a number of years that it was only through such co-operation that we of the Pacific coast could obtain the recognition due us.
At Portland, Oregon, four years ago, in a public address I outlined a commercial and political alliance of the Pacific coast states, with just such an object in view as is set forth regarding the proposed alliance of our representatives in congress.
At that time I said we had need of AN OFFENSIVE AND DEFENSIVE ALLIANCE IF WE EXPECTED TO COMPETE WITH THE EAST.
In my outline at that time I called attention to the fact that the interests of the Pacific coast states were identical and that a community of purpose of the representatives, of Washington, Oregon, California, Idaho, Nevada and the territory of Arizona would bring about an alliance as strong as to command from the national congress the passage of any measure the combination united upon.
It is unnecessary for me to go into detail of the benefits that will come through such a combination of forces.
I desire to assure you that the California Promotion committee, which allied with it one hundred and ninety-five commercial organizations in the state, with a combined membership of more than thirty thousand, will give its hearty support and co-operation to such a combination of representatives of the Pacific coast states, and will use its every endeavor to bring about A CO-OPERATION IN ALL THE STATES INVOLVED such as will give to you and your colleagues a moral backing sufficient to make your united action most effective.
Feeling confident that the proposed combination of senators and representatives in congress from the Pacific coast states will be one of the most potent factors in bringing about a betterment of conditions for the entire coast, and congratulating you and your colleagues upon the good work you have thus inaugurated, I am, cordially yours."
