HOW THE THING WAS DONE.

John F. Carroll, editor of the Portland Telegram, who made the "Fight in Multnomah" county for Cake has an editorial under the above heading that throws some light on the election of Chamberlain to the Senate:

"Outside of his own party there were three distinct and traceable elements which, united, brought about the election of Gov. Chamberlain by the small plurality which gives him the Senatorship. First and foremost of these was the vote of the Fulton Republicans; secondly, the whisky vote, and thirdly, the vote of the thick and thin opponents of Statement No. 1.

"Mr. Fulton went into the primaries to secure the Senatorial nomination and suffered defeat. The claim was put forth by his friends that he had been defeated, not by Republicans, but by Democrats, who, having registered as Republicans, voted for his rival in the belief that it would be easier to defeat him than it would be to defeat Fulton. It is true that a number of Democrats registered as Republicans for this very purpose; that they contributed to the result of Cake's nomination is equally true, but that they were the decisive factors in it nobody of discernment believes. Statement No. 1 could plead guilty to that.

"But the Fulton adherents seized this as a pretext and set to work systematically and with cool deliberation to add in Governor Chamberlain's election and to hamstring Cake. There were Fulton lieutenants who had been most active in his primary campaign, and even still more active in his state convention campaign, who, by quick transformation immediately after Fulton's defeat in the primaries, became the trusted agents and active emissaries of Chamberlain. In the class of his active, if secret, supporters were many of the men who controlled the recent state convention that named none but Fulton men as delegates or alternates to the National Republican Convention, which meets in Chicago the middle of the present month. We are presented, therefore, with the very extraordinary spectacle of the Fulton Republicans electing a Democratic Senator and ready to hilariously start a few days hence for Chicago there to help name the man whom they fondly hope will be the next Republican President of the United States, and whom, on the strength of service rendered the party in Oregon, they expect will elevate Mr. Charles William Fulton to a position of National political responsibility. Let those who will try to match this spectacle in all the

variegated annals of Oregon's political history.

"The opponents of Statement No. 1, not exclusively, but still very largely, voted for Chamberlain in pursuance of a conspiracy to give him the popular vote and subsequently to elect some Republican, Fulton perhaps preferred, through the Legislature. But by a peculiar and unforeseen twist of fate, there will be at least fifty-two Statement No. 1 votes in the legislative ninety, each one solemnly pledged, and just as solemnly elected on that pledge, to vote for the popular choice for Senator:

"The whisky interests, which were never so effectively organized as this year, voted almost to a man for Chamberlain. The strong local option fights spread pretty well over the state, rendered this vote particularly active and to the degree it was active it added to Chamberlain's total tally. In this county the spectacle was a peculiar one. The Chamberlain-Manning machine, which has been a more or less definite entity ever since Chamberlain went out of the District Attorney's office and appointed Manning to succeed him, received only partial recognition this year. Manning, the tail end of the machine was cut by the whisky element, while Chamberlain, the head of the machine, was supported by it with an enthusiasm very seldom displayed in any cause.

Combined, these explain the unusual elements which united to aid Governor Chamberlain. Under all the circumstances it is amazing that his plurality should not be countable by the thousands, instead of the hundreds. Such as it is, however, it is ample, and leaves no possible ground for doubt that he is the popular choice, no matter what the motive which actuated the Republicans of the state in electing a Democratic Senator."

CALIFORNIA HAS BRIGHT OUTLOOK

Conditions in California in all matters pertaining to material progress are excellent. The crop outlook continues to improve and with the single exception of prunes, which will be below the average, all fruits will reach a production above the average. Indications for peaches and apricots are that California will produce the largest crop in its history. Reports received by The California Promotion Committee from every fruit district in the State show that this will probably be the banner year.

Late rains did slight injury to cut hay in certain localities, but the great benefit of these rains to other crops greatly offset this damage. Grapes will make an especially abundant crop this year, and already preparations are being made to harvest them. The demand for labor in the agricultural districts of the State is increasing, and thousands of men and women can find steady employment.

The voting of \$18,200,000 improvement bonds by San Francisco, together with the voting of road improvement bonds and school bonds in many parts of the state, indicate that there will be a great demand for labor for public improvements during the coming year.

The movement for good roads in California has crystallized in the ninth semi-annual meeting of the Counties Committee of The California Promotion Committee, to be held in Santa Cruz on June 6, where ways and means will be devised to make this a great State movement.

Several large tracts of land have been purchased by syndicates for the purpose of subdivision into small farms, and these will be put on the market during the summer, thus inducing many settlers to come to the State.
