WESTERN PACIFIC IN AGREEMENT WITH JAPANESE

San Francisco, June 15.—Rail road circles are today discussing the reported agreement between the Western Pacific, and the Toyo Kisen Kaisha, the Japanese steamship line running between here and the Orient, by which the Western Pacific is to have connections with the Orient through the Japanese company's boats.

The agreement is said to become effective next year when the Western Pacific road to Salt Lake is completed.

BARNETT TRIED TO SELL WESTERN PACIFIC

San Francisco, June 15.—That the officials of the wrecked California Safe Deposit & Trust company tried to sell their Western Pacific stock to Harriman in order to get money to cover up their deficits was the startling statement made on the stand in the Barnett trial today by J. Dalzell Brown, the convict banker who is turning state's evidence against Barnett. Brown testified that Barnett was willing to betray Gould in his desperation to get money.

FOUR THOUSAND OF SULTAN'S TROOPS REBEL

Tangier, June 15.—After revolting, 4000 troops of the sultan, Abdel Aziz, have taken a French commander and three other officers prisoners. Serious trouble is expected, and the sultan is prepared to make a stand with the soldiers who remain loyal to him.

Ferry Begins.

The ferry across the Willamette river began operation at 12 o'clock today, and is carrying a good number of passengers between the two counties. The fare is free, and the boat is proving a great accommodation to people who live in Polk county and who transact their business in Salem. This favor is due to the generosity of the Minto brothers, the owners of the ferry. When the bridge was closed they at once offered the county the use of the boat, and then proceeded to install it. The landing on this side of the river is near the foot of State street.

Ford Inheritance Tax.

The sheriff this morning filed notice of the recipients of bequests from the estate of the late Timon Ford, of the state inheritance tax which is due from each beneficiary. The total amount of the Ford bequests is \$134,231.02, and from this the state will receive in inheritance taxes \$1716.40.
