CHATAUQUA ASSEMBLY AT SALEM

MOVEMENT IS NOW STARTED

The weekly assembly this morning at 10:15 at Willamette university was graced with the presence of some of Salem's busy boosters who are always looking for some way to advance this city. HARRIMAN WANTS THE WELLS FARGO EXPRESS TO TEACH FOREIGN LANGUAGE

New York, Nov. 13.—E. H. Harriman is today strengthening his position in the Wells Fargo Express company, according to well founded reports on Wall street. Within the last few days representatives of the New York law firm of Sullivan & Cromwell have been in Boston offering \$300 per share to New England holders of Wells Fargo company stock, and stating that they were buying the stock for Harriman.

Wells Fargo sold Wednesday for \$310 in New York. The company pays dividends of 10 per cent and it is understood to be earning largely in excess of this amount. In addition to its large express business the company controls the Wells Fargo bank in San Francisco which has \$24,000,000 of deposits, a capital of \$6,000,000 and a surplus of \$5,000,000.
