BAR ASSOCIATION HAS BIG CONTRACT

(United Press Leased Wire.) Aberdeen, Wash., July 16.—At the meeting of the State Bar Association, to be held here July 29-31, Herbert N. De Wolfe, the Tacoma attorney, whose charges against members of the state supreme court resulted in an investigation by a house committee of the legislature, will be asked to appear and substantiate his charges with proof. Failing in this city, De Wolfe will likely face disbarment proceedings. Judge J. W. Robinson, of Olympia, will also be asked to furnish the association proof of the accusations he made against the supreme court in the primary campaign last fall. In addition the association proposes to make a subject of inquiry the cause of the retirement of former Supreme Court Judge Milo Root, the indictment at Spokane of Judge Gordon on a charge of embezzlement in connection with his former service with the Great Northern railway, and the relations existing between the two while Root occupied a seat on the supreme bench.
